You also need some yoghurt. Mix the sugar and the butter, then put the eggs in. Now put the flour and the baking powder in. Put your mixture into four different bowls. Mix the milk, the strawberries and the yoghurt and put them in a blender. Put different food colouring in two different bowls. Put three drops of green food colouring into another bowl. Put one teaspoon of cocoa into one bowl. Switch on the blender and you get delicious milkshakes. Then mix everything together. Put the cake into the oven and bake for 35 minutes.

cacao,
food colouring,
 200 grams of butter
 200 grams of sugar
200 grams of flour
baking powder
 three eggs.

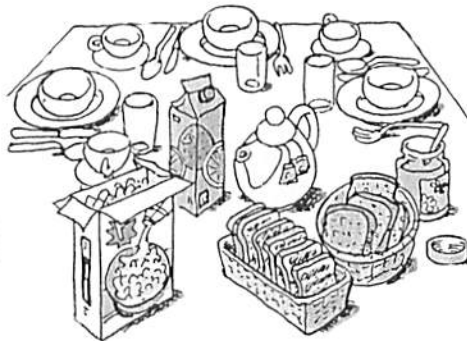

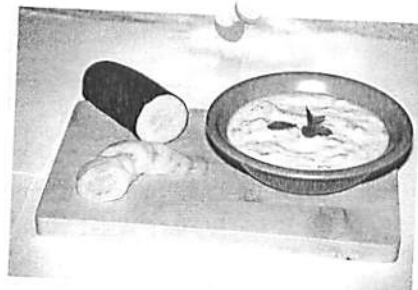
